Hi All,

I hope this email finds you well and that you had a good start to 2025.

Following our last meeting in November 2024, the IPC had considered the various ways in which we may assist the committee and progress the network in 2025.

After careful consideration, and as there have been no volunteers for the Chair of the Practitioners Committee following Robert's departure, the IPC proposes to create a new 'IPC Stakeholder Forum' to continue collaboration and knowledge-sharing among right to know and privacy practitioners.

The intention of the new Stakeholder Forum is to provide a similar experience as the previous network with bi-annual meetings featuring Commissioner updates, external presenters and content suggested by the Committee.

We understand that this represents a significant change given the long-standing committee and network that has served us well for many years. We value and appreciate your feedback on our proposed idea.

If the committee supports this change, we will need to develop our own stakeholder contact list. This will require someone on the committee who has access to the previous contact list from Robert, to send an email advising of the change and providing a link to register for the new IPC Stakeholder Forum. We are able to assist with some wording should you require it. Our initial thoughts are to limit signups to NSW government email addresses only to make sure only NSW government staff are members.

Please let us know your thoughts about the proposed new Stakeholder Forum and we look forward to working together again this year.
